There was this little boy who always wondered about sea birds that soar high over the ocean! Sea gulls that fly high captured his imagination and he wanted to fly high as a sea bird. He dreamed of designing rockets to explore the milky way. It inspired him to become an aerospace scientist, and a humanitarian who made a huge difference in the world and went to become the president of India. He is none other than the great scientist, APJ Kalam.

One day he visited a public school where he met some children with disabilities who were unable to play with other kids. He was deeply moved by their plight and decided to do something about it. He went back to work and along with a group of scientists, designed light weight prosthetics, with composite heat materials usually they use for making rockets. He reduced the weight of prosthetics by ten times. A few months later he visited the children again, and saw them running and playing using the light weight artificial limbs he had made. Did you know the story of the origin of the Christmas creche? Excerpt from Fr. William Saunder's Francis and the Christmas Creche

In the year 1223, St Francis, as deacon, was visiting the town of Grecio to celebrate Christmas. The town was built on a mountainside overlooking a beautiful valley. St. Francis realized the chapel of the Franciscan hermitage would be too small to hold the congregation for Midnight Mass so he found a niche in the rock near the town. St. Francis desired to commemorate the nativity with all solemnity and asked permission from the Pope to prepare a living nativity. He brought in a manger, hay, and an ox and ass. The brethren were gathered and people came filling the forest with their voices in psalms of praise, surrounded by brilliant lights.

St. Francis stood before the manger full of devotion and bathed in tears of radiant joy as the Holy Gospel was chanted. He then, preached to the people around the nativity of the poor King, and being unable to utter His name, out of the tenderness of his love for Him, he referred to Him as the Babe of Bethlehem.

A soldier, who had left warfare for the love of Christ saw Francis holding an Infant, sleeping in the manger, whom Francis embraced with both his arms, as if he would awake Him from sleep. In weeks following this vision the hay from the manger was kept in a special place and when touched by the sick they were cured!

Although this story is long old, the message is clear for us. Our own Nativity scenes which rest under our Christmas trees are a visible reminder of that night when our Savior was born. May we never forget to see in our hearts the little Babe of Bethlehem, who came to save us from sin. We must never forget that the wood of the manger that held Him so securely would one day give way to the wood of the cross.

May we too embrace Him with our love as did St. Francis.

Eucharistic Adoration




